Social Justice Week.

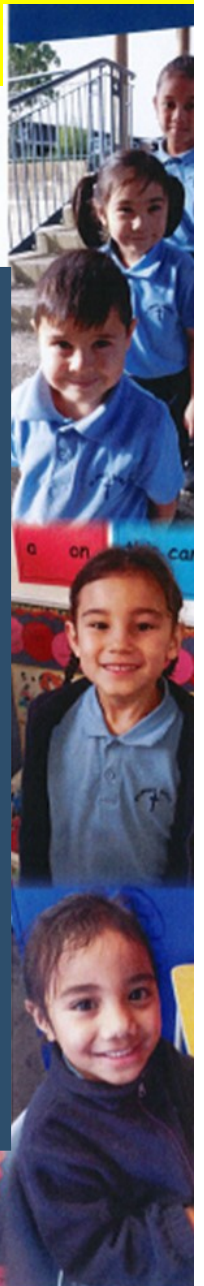
The theme for this week is:

into our educational leadership through a Pacific Lens. Part of this experience was a focus on building and strengthening the Pasifika capability of leaders.

We stayed in Apia and there visited Vaiala Beach School. We also visited two village schools (Satitōa Primary School). This school had been totally devastated by the Tsunami in 2009, and had moved from the old site to a new site inland. The other village school was on the island of Savaii, Sapapalii Primary School. Ms Brayne and I also visited Don Bosco Technical College.

Three of the four schools welcomed us formally with a Samoan Ava Ceremony. We were treated to yummy food that included traditional Samoan dishes—all natural and made with love and respect.

Ms Brayne also visited her mother's village, Falefa and caught up with aiga.

We were amazed at the children, They were so friendly, welcoming and so proud to share their learning. The Teachers and Principals are doing the best they can with very limited resources.

Both Ms Brayne and I feel very privileged to be part of this incredible learning experience. Thank you to the Board of Trustees.

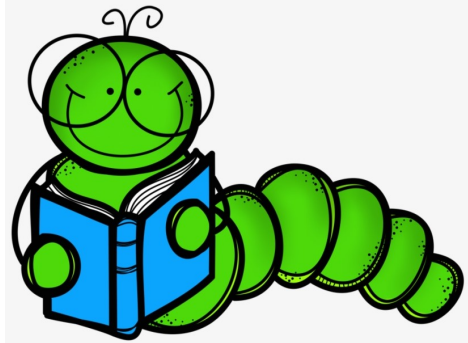
