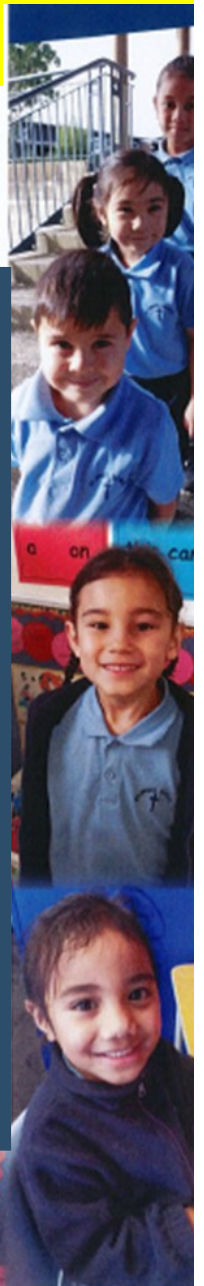

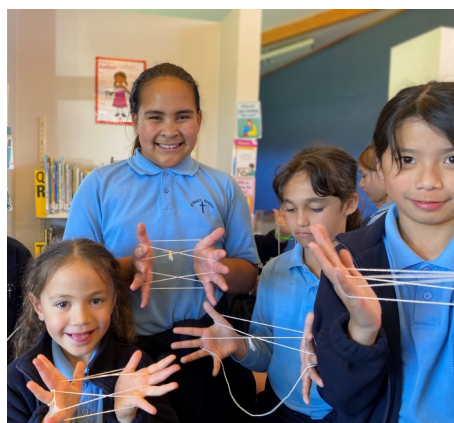
Social Justice Week
