Caregiver App @school mobile app

You can download the app from Playstore or Applestore and use the user ID given through the etap caregiver set up email.

Please use the @school mobile app to report if your child is absent from school.

This is the best way for your child's teacher to receive correct information to mark the school roll, which is a legal requirement of schools.
