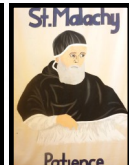

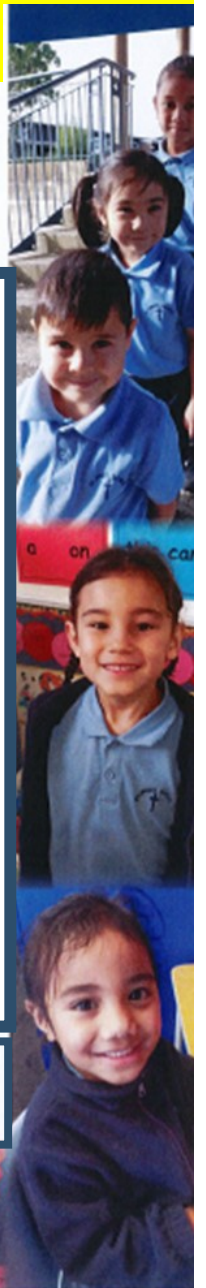
ST EUGENE FEAST DAY
