It was great to see everyone back at school last week. I hope that you have all started your Reading Nights. If you have, then you will be up to **7 Reading Nights.** What a great start to achieving your goal of 275 Reading Nights.

During the holiday break the surface of our Senior Playground' was upgraded. Soft fill was installed on top of the rubber matting. 100 cubic meters of soft fill to be exact, at a cost of \$25,000.

Class gardens are being tidied, and over the term our children will be planting, beautifying and maintaining their own class garden. There will be a prize for the best garden. This is a way of showing respect for our place and beautifying our school environment.

Large numbers of students made a commitment to one of these groups. This is fantastic. Thank you parents for our wonderful tamariki. They are keen learners.

Our school attendance really improved in Term 4, 2024 with 76% of students attending school 90% of the time during Term Four. This was much better than Term 3 with 61% attendance. Wouldn't it be great if over 90% of our students attended school 90% of the time. Of course this is an aspirational goal. But why not?

Please remember that you must inform the school using the @school App on the day that your child is away. The Ministry of Education is checking all school attendance on a daily basis, receiving the attendance roll at 6.00pm.

If your child is away and the school does not know why, then they will be marked as Truant. This is not a good look for the future.

Try to refrain from organising holidays during school time.

A concerning trend at St Paul's School is the number of students who are late. In Term Four 2024, 80% of students were on time, therefore 20% were late. Parents please get your child up early as we know that traffic will always be an issue. Don Buck Rd is always busy. Please help your child be punctual. This is an important life habit.
