What an amazing change in the weather. Great to see the autumn sun.

I am sharing the data about our attendance last term. 77% of students regularly attended school. This means they were at school 90% of the time. This is an improvement from Term One, 2024.

16% had irregular attendance compared to 19% last year. This means that they attended school between 80 and 90% of the time.

4% had moderate attendance compared to 5% last year and 3% were chronically absent compared to 2% last year.

As I have stated on numerous occasions attendance at school is vital for students to make progress and achieve excellence.

Continue supporting your child/children to make attendance at school a priority.

Could you also ensure that your child is on time for school? This way they have an opportunity to prepare for the school day, settle in play with their friends and begin the school day with prayer or karakia. If you are late between 8.45am and 9.00am, the children go straight to their class. If they arrive at school after 9.00am, they must go to the office.

This week is Sign Language Week. This is one of New Zealand's official languages. Our children have been learning. Ask your child what they know.

Last week I forgot to mention that Micah Lim also helped clean up the reflection area. Well done Micah.

Reminders:

Please do not use the staff carpark to drop off and pick up children. It is for staff and service vehicles only.

If you are walking your children home do not walk through the staff carpark, use the lower pedestrian crossing. This is the safer option.
