Student Led Conferences

Wednesday 25 June is the date for our Student Led conferences. The school will close early at 12.00pm on this day. Student Led Conferences will begin at 1.00pm. Bookings for this event have been sent out via the @school app. Please ensure you have the app on your phone.

After School Care will supervise children who are usually booked in, from 12.00pm.

Parents bring your child /children with you to the Student Led Conferences. The children will talk about their learning and their progress and achievements.

Homework

All children who began school this year on the first day and have been reading every night will be up to 119 Reading Nights. Your next certificate will be at 125 Reading Nights.

Parents, as well as reading, it is really important that your child learns the mathematics basic facts of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Children need to be able to recall all the facts instantly in order to solve harder maths problems. The work in the Homework Diary is just minimal. Help your child to learn these 'off by heart,' in other words they need to be memorised. A number of Secondary School Principals have spoken to me about their concerns around this issue. Children need to know all their basic facts by the time they leave primary school.
