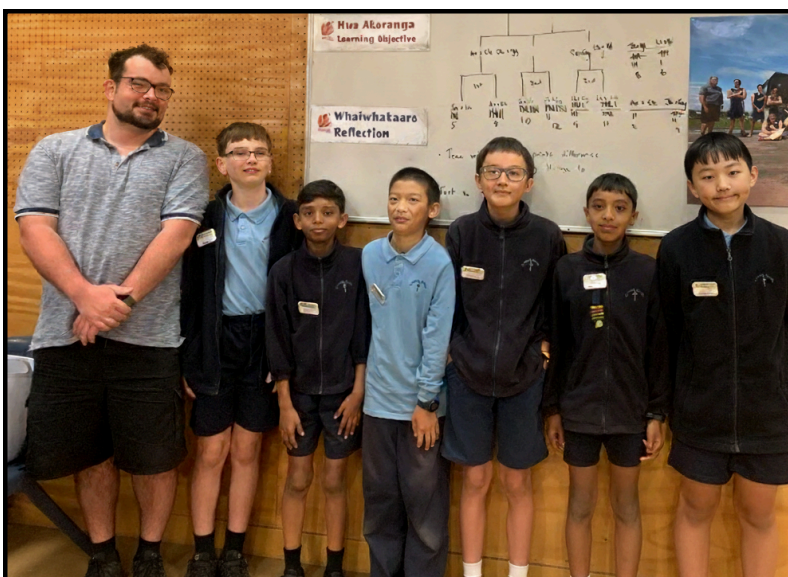
School photos took place on Tuesday the 28th October.
